Greetings to all current members, and through you to the network of collaborators and students with whom you work. We are at an exciting time in the evolution of our discipline: many countries are permitting high-level health claims along the lines of 'a diet rich in fruit and vegetables may reduce the risk of coronary heart disease or stroke'. Evidence for protective roles of particular phytochemicals, often in combination with fibre, is mounting. The complexity of our understanding of the processes modifying ingested phytochemicals, their interaction with our gut flora, and the triggering of defensive processes within the body, is constantly growing in volume and complexity. But it is also a time when extravagant claims continue to be made for particular fruit or vegetables, or for extracts and isolates. It is vital that horticultural scientists with an interest in the human health impacts of fruit and vegetables share their findings responsibly. We are all well aware of the confusion caused in consumers' minds when irresponsible scientists attempt to claim their 15 minutes of fame by refuting all that you have previously heard...

Antioxidants 2018 Travel Award


